The bulk of the credit goes to our strong volunteer network of club members who make an outstanding effort every year to improve the services and hospitality they provide. And we also benefit substantially from our group of Show Chairmen who are now some of the most experienced and hospitable in their areas as any at any national APS WSP show.

Kathy Johnson of the Chicago area, serving as an exhibit judge at the show commented on how vibrant the show floor was on Friday during set-up. Kathy gets to a lot of national level shows each year and she still took notice of the effort and enthusiasm that our club puts into our show. It is special and notable and we can take pride in it.

We hosted *Unhinged*, a group of six exhibitors from the New England area who travelled here to shop, exhibit and socialize this year with us. They could have chosen to go anywhere, but came to our show.

- Our Jury for 2015 were Ken Nilsestuen of Ohio, Kathy Johnson of Illinois and Jeff Switt of Texas. Ken is the current Treasurer of the APS and a candidate for APS President in the 2016 election. Kathy is a past APS Treasurer and Jeff is a long-time supporter of GHSS, so we thank them for taking time from their schedules to join and support us.
- We drew an Indigo crayon from the tin on Saturday night and we declared Blue as the 2016 color for our nationally renowned Single-Frame color competition.
- We had fellowship dinners on Thursday (after set-up) and Friday night and had 20 or more at each dinner. We also had a nice club sponsored dinner Sunday night for those who helped with the show tear-down.
- Our Beginners' Booth was busy throughout the weekend and helped educate several new collectors and put smiles on some young faces.

Jane King Fohn is GHSS 2014 Grand Award Winner

For the second time in just over a month Jane King Fohn's exhibit, *The 9-Cent Alamo Stamp and its First Day Covers*, has capture a stamp show Grand Award.

Her exhibit won the top award at Americover in Columbus, Ohio, on August 15. Americover is the premiere exhibition in the country featuring first day covers and is one of the American Philatelic Society's World Series Champion-of-Champions shows. Jane's exhibit, as a result of winning Americover, will be in the C-of-C competition in Portland, Oregon next summer at STaMpsHow 2016.

Prior to winning Americover, she applied for GHSS and was accepted as a competitive exhibit. The GHSS jury were impressed and awarded her the top prize at Greater Houston Stamp Show. In addition to the Grand Award, she won the United States Stamp Society President's Award for best exhibit of U.S. material and the Texas Philatelic Society's President's Award for best exhibit by a TPA member or Texas resident.

The Reserve Grand Award went to Anthony Dewey for his exhibit *The 1991 "F" Tulip Stamps and Their First Day Covers*. The exhibit was spectacular, including several outstanding pieces from the American Banknote archives.

Tony showed as a member of Unhinged, a group of New England area exhibitors who enjoy travelling to stamp shows and competing in the open competition. Six of the group travelled to Houston for GHSS and we were delighted to host them. Along with Tony, Paul Goodwin, Jeff Shapiro, Charles Ekstrom, David Kent and Larry Fillion all exhibited here.

Jay Stotts won the Single Frame competition with his *The 25 Cent Niagara Falls Stamp of 1922-38*. The exhibit also won the Single Frame Green Stamp competition and the Barry's Challenge. He signed the *Scroll of Many Colors*.

Ron Strawser's exhibit, The Belgian Congo 10 Centime Reply Card Issue of 1900 and Its Overprints Through 1910 won the Single Frame Reserve Grand.

Additional HPS member exhibiting were William Drummond, David Willig, Denise Stotts, Bryant Korn and Vic Willson. We would like to express our thanks to all the GHSS exhibitors.
